## TIMBRE

**TONE COLOUR:** The quality of the sound that is heard.

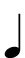

## FORM

How is the material of the solo organised?

**FORMAL STRUCTURE (FORM):** The organisation and structure of a composition and the interrelationships of musical events within the overall structure.

**TEXTURE:** A cross-section or side-on view which describes the layers of sound in a piece of music.

### LAYERS OF SOUND

- Monophonic (*single voice/part*)
- Unison (*more than one person singing the same part*)
- Tutti (*the whole orchestra plays together, or the whole choir sings together*)
- Homophonic (*melody with chords*)
- Polyphonic (*one part starting at different times, like a round*)
- Heterophonic (*main melody, another melody which parallels it, but not exactly*)
- Descant or Counter Melody (*a second melody playing alongside the main melody*)
- Monophonic (*single voice/part*)
